2. Advisor attendance at Advisor's Conference: At least one advisor per club must attend.	3	
3. Average attendance at local meetings: 90-100% (12 pts.), 80-89% (10 pts.), 70-79% (8 pts.), 60-69% (6 pts.). This will be computed using a formula which will take into account the membership and the total meetings, based on attendance records in your secretary's book. Members may only be excused for other 4-H related activities, school activities, or extreme family emergencies. Excused members are marked as present. Advisors may assign make up work at their discretion for work related absences, etc. <u>Do not list advisors on the attendance chart.</u> Members must be marked present or absent for each meeting.	12	
4. Percent Completion: Based on enrollment and total number of projects enrolled in on May 1. Completion requires evaluation at judging, absentee judging, interview by superintendent, or a letter to the 4-H Committee. 100% (14 pts.) 79-83% (6 pts.) 94-99% (12 pts.) 74-78% (4 pts.) 89-93% (10 pts.) 69-73% (2 pts.) 84-88% (8 pts.)
