3. An applicant must apply, be accepted, and attend a college or technical school. Please attach proof of acceptance from the college or technical school.
4. Two letters of recommendation (preferably from instructors or employers) must be included with the application.

Kevin Zimmerman was an advisor in Huron County for 43 years with the Hartland Progressive Farmers 4-H Club. He passed away on August 10, 2011 after a long and courageous battle with cancer. Kevin's 4-H career began in 1960 when he joined the West Hartland Booster Sr. 4-H Club. During his 9 years as a 4-H member, he held many club offices. Along with these positions, Kevin took pride in his dairy cattle and vegetable crop projects which resulted in A grades. Kevin also participated in 4-H activities outside of his club. He attended 4-H Camp Conger and was a Junior Leader. He represented Huron County at Conservation Camp, was a delegate to the Ohio 4-H Club Congress, and won awards competing in the Junior Team Demonstration Contest. Throughout his 4-H career, Kevin was recognized with many other awards. He earned the County Award for Achievement, the County Award for Grain Marketing, and the County Award for Field Crops twice.

After graduating from Western Reserve High School, Kevin attended The Ohio State University. He earned a degree in agriculture with a Bachelor of Science in Agronomy. The same year Kevin started college, he became an advisor with the West Hartland Booster Sr. 4-H Club. He was 19 and naturally transitioned roles from member to advisor.

In 1973, the club name was changed to the current name of Hartland Progressive Farmers. Advising a club by this name was appropriate since Kevin was a progressive, self-employed farmer in Hartland Township. As an advisor, he taught 4-H members not only how to successfully complete their projects, but also taught them many life lessons along the way. Kevin always gave encouraging words to all 4-H kids he encountered, and he strived to help them make the best better!

During fair week, Kevin helped with 4-H behind the scenes. In the 4-H Miscellaneous Project Building, he assisted with keeping all the 4-Hers organized as they checked in for their judging times. He also helped supervise in the building during the week. Throughout the years that his two daughters showed cattle, Kevin could be found at "his spot" in the old Jr. Dairy Barn by the south side door. He assisted in everything from lining up cattle for weigh-in, judging, and sales, to getting feeder calves' legs untangled from ropes in the calf pens. Kevin was always ready to lend a helping hand to anyone in need.

Kevin was a great advocate of 4-H out in the community. He brought many new members into the 4-H program by promoting the benefits to youth and their parents.

Our family's goal is to honor Kevin's years of dedicated service as a 4-H advisor. We are offering a \$500 scholarship to a high school senior planning to further his or her education.
